Our goal is to provide a complete academic and clinical training pathway that helps dentists build strong foundations in Pediatric Dentistry according to modern international clinical standards.

Through structured mentorship, direct clinical supervision, academic preparation, and real clinical exposure, we aim to help every trainee develop into a confident and highly skilled pediatric dentist.

ROLES AND REGULATIONS

Duration:

- 3 years clinical training program divided into 6 semesters.

Weekly Schedule:

- 3 training days per week. • 1 day theoretical lectures. • 1 day hands-on clinical training. • 1 day online case discussion session.

General Rules:

- Candidates are expected to show high levels of professionalism and commitment throughout the program.
- Candidates will receive lectures, workshops, Journal Clubs, clinical supervision, and practical training covering all major aspects of Pediatric Dentistry.
- Candidates are expected to demonstrate continuous academic and clinical improvement during assessments and clinical evaluations.
- Candidates who fail to pass assessments or fail to demonstrate continuous progress may be required to repeat the failed semester.
- Attendance of at least 75% of lectures, discussions, and clinical sessions is mandatory.
- Monthly mock exams and final term examinations are part of the academic pathway.
- Successful completion of all assessments is mandatory for progression within the program.
- Upon successful completion of the 3-year program, trainees become eligible for advanced fellowship pathways and international academic opportunities.

CODE OF CONDUCT

- A zero-tolerance policy is applied toward unethical behavior, patient misconduct, or violation of professional standards.
- Candidates must follow all infection control and patient safety protocols.
- Professional appearance and clinical discipline are mandatory during all clinical sessions.

- Trainees are expected to respect supervisors, colleagues, staff members, and patients at all times.
- Any inappropriate behavior inside clinics, lectures, or training facilities may lead to disciplinary action.
- The academy reserves the right to modify training policies whenever necessary.

RESEARCH & FELLOWSHIP PATHWAY

- Candidates will receive training in Research Methodology and Evidence-Based Dentistry.
- Clinical research discussions and audit principles are integrated within the academic pathway.
- Trainees are expected to participate in clinical research activities during the program.
- Guidance for clinical research preparation required for international pathways will be provided.
- FDS preparation sessions are included during the program.
- Fellowship-oriented preparation for Part A and Part B pathways is included through structured academic support.
- Recommendation and academic guidance may be provided for eligible trainees pursuing international Pediatric Dentistry pathways.

THE CLINICAL PART

CLINICAL TRAINING PROTOCOL

To begin clinical training, the trainee must:

- Complete the required academic foundation phase.
- Attend at least 75% of lectures and workshops.
- Successfully pass the required academic assessments.
- Complete infection control orientation with clinical supervisors.
- Understand all clinic workflow and patient management protocols.
- Follow the official clinical dress code.
- Use sterilized instruments and approved materials only.
- Respect patient appointment timing and clinical workflow.
- Maintain professional communication with patients and staff members.

CASE DISTRIBUTION PROTOCOL

- Each trainee will receive supervised pediatric clinical cases during the program.
- Case distribution is supervised directly by clinical supervisors.
- No new cases will be assigned before completing the required clinical responsibilities for current cases.
- Each trainee is required to prepare diagnosis discussions and treatment planning presentations.
- Clinical records and patient documentation must be completed accurately.
- Clinical decisions and treatment progression require supervisor approval.
- Trainees are expected to demonstrate evidence-based clinical reasoning during case discussions.

CLINICAL FOLLOW-UP PROTOCOL

- All cases must be followed regularly according to supervisor instructions.
- Every clinical step must be documented and approved by supervisors.
- Cases should be managed according to professional clinical workflow standards.
- Trainees are expected to present mid-treatment and follow-up discussions when requested.
- Clinical discussions may include justification of treatment planning, material selection, behavior management, and procedural decisions.
- Trainees must maintain updated case records and clinical documentation throughout the program.

GENERAL ANESTHESIA (GA) TRAINING

The FPaed Training Program includes structured exposure to General Anesthesia pediatric cases.

GA Training Includes:

- Attendance in 25 General Anesthesia cases as assistant doctor.
- Performing 5 General Anesthesia cases as primary operator under supervision.
- Exposure to operating room workflow and multidisciplinary patient management.
- Training focused on patient safety, teamwork, and advanced pediatric case handling.

INTERDISCIPLINARY & ADVANCED CASES

The program includes interdisciplinary treatment planning with specialized teams in:

- Cleft Lip & Palate cases through Smile Train Organization.
- Pediatric-Orthodontic interdisciplinary cases.

- Pediatric restorative and prosthetic rehabilitation cases.
- Pediatric surgery-related workflows.
- Special needs and medically compromised pediatric patients.

The goal is to help trainees understand comprehensive pediatric treatment planning within real multidisciplinary clinical environments.

ASSESSMENT SYSTEM

- Monthly Mock Exams are conducted throughout the program.
- Final Exams are held at the end of each term.
- Passing assessments is mandatory for progression within the program.
- In case of failing an examination, one additional trial is allowed.
- Failure of the second trial requires repeating the entire term.
- Performance evaluations are conducted every 3 months.
- Continuous clinical and academic assessment is part of the training process.

DEMERIT SYSTEM

- Professionalism and commitment are essential parts of the training program.
- Violation of infection control policies may result in demerit points.
- Repeated delays in patient appointments may result in disciplinary action.
- Practicing clinical procedures without supervision is prohibited.
- Incomplete documentation or failure to follow clinical protocols may result in penalties.
- Repeated violations may lead to suspension or termination from the program

WITHDRAWAL POLICY

- Candidates are allowed to pause training for a maximum of two semesters.

APPLICATION & PAYMENT POLICY

- Candidates must attend a personal interview before acceptance.

- Accepted candidates must complete payment procedures before the start of the semester.
- Semester fees must be paid according to the official payment schedule.
- Delay in payment may result in temporary suspension of website access or clinical training.
- Continuous failure to complete financial requirements may lead to suspension from the program.
